



He was wanted for assault, bank robbery, murdering an officer, escaping jail 3 times, assault of an officer and grand theft auto!


How did he escape?



Why did they go to prison?


Frank was charged with possession of narcotics and armed robbery, John was charged with was charged with armed robbery and so was Clarence!

John and Clarence were born into a family of 13 kids.


The Expert Says...
